Guidance summary Allocated on a per pupil basis

Estimated at £95k for Hope after adjusting for current census (from £93k)

Designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by COVID

Only available for 1 year 2020-2021

Used for specific activities to support catch up in line with guidance on curriculum expectations

Flexibility to spend in the best way for the cohort but uses

- Small group one to one tuition (through tutoring programme)
- Summer programmes to help re-engage

Different to the National Tutoring programme which will be launched in September and available from November (for disadvantaged)

Teaching and whole school strategies

- supporting teaching through professional development, focus on training in use of visualisers
- Training all staff in the Academies Access All Areas Literacy Strategy (to focus on de-coding, fluency, vocabulary, texts within context)
- assessing impact of Covid-19 on pupil wellbeing and learning

Targeted support

- small group tuition for most affected pupils/groups
- intervention programmes for students with lowest engagement during lockdown
- Counselling for students who have experienced trauma pre and during COVID-19

Wider strategies

- transition support and mentoring for new Y7
- improved access to technology for pupils (laptops)
- Online Revision Tools to support home learning for Yrs 10 and 11/Resources for home learning
