#### 1 Corinthians 15:12-32

#### The Resurrection of the Dead

<sup>12</sup> Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? <sup>13</sup> But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. <sup>14</sup> And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. <sup>15</sup> We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified about God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. <sup>16</sup> For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. <sup>17</sup> And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. <sup>18</sup> Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. <sup>19</sup> If in Christ we have hope<sup>[a]</sup> in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied.

<sup>20</sup> But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. <sup>23</sup> But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. <sup>24</sup> Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. <sup>25</sup> For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. <sup>26</sup> The last enemy to be destroyed is death. <sup>27</sup> For "God<sup>[b]</sup> has put all things in subjection under his feet." But when it says, "all things are put in subjection," it is plain that he is excepted who put all things in subjection under him. <sup>28</sup> When all things are subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to him who put all things in subjection under him, that God may be all in all.

<sup>29</sup> Otherwise, what do people mean by being baptized on behalf of the dead? If the dead are not raised at all, why are people baptized on their behalf? <sup>30</sup> Why are we in danger every hour? <sup>31</sup> I protest, brothers, by my pride in you, which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die every day! <sup>32</sup> What do I gain if, humanly speaking, I fought with beasts at Ephesus? If the dead are not raised, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die."





#### Maureen receiving Holy Communion



## The role of the church in the local community: Street Pastors

## 'Faith by itself without action is dead.'

James 2:17 (NIV)

#### Parish Nursing

Parish Nursing ministries UK is a Christian charity which supports whole person healthcare through the local church. In Walton Parish, Felixstowe, three churches partner a project that provides registered parish nurses to promote wellbeing in body, mind and spirit. This work includes diagnosing early signs of health problems, training and coordinating volunteers to help alleviate loneliness or provide support during time of crisis and giving additional help to the NHS. They encourage healthy living through exercise and health advice. Their focus is on the person rather than just their medical condition, and they will listen to problems, give reassurance, pray with them if asked and direct them to specific services if required.

### The place of mission and evangelism

#### Acts 17:6-15

<sup>6</sup> But when they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some other believers before the city officials, shouting: "These men who have caused trouble all over the world have now come here, <sup>7</sup> and Jason has welcomed them into his house. They are all defying Caesar's decrees, saying that there is another king, one called Jesus." <sup>8</sup> When they heard this, the crowd and the city officials were thrown into turmoil. <sup>9</sup> Then they made Jason and the others post bond and let them go.


#### In Berea

<sup>10</sup> As soon as it was night, the believers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea. On arriving there, they went to the Jewish synagogue. <sup>11</sup> Now the Berean Jews were of more noble character than those in Thessalonica, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. <sup>12</sup> As a result, many of them believed, as did also a number of prominent Greek women and many Greek men.

<sup>13</sup> But when the Jews in Thessalonica learned that Paul was preaching the word of God at Berea, some of them went there too, agitating the crowds and stirring them up. <sup>14</sup> The believers immediately sent Paul to the coast, but Silas and Timothy stayed at Berea. <sup>15</sup> Those who escorted Paul brought him to Athens and then left with instructions for Silas and Timothy to join him as soon as possible.

## Christian persecution

#### North Korea (1)

Since 2002, North Korea (1) has been the most difficult place to follow Jesus. But terrible though it is, it's not an outlier. Afghanistan (2) and Somalia (3) are close behind in the Open Doors analysis of persecution risk.

#### Burkina Faso (28)

Last year, <u>Burkina Faso</u> wasn't even in the top 50. Now it's the 28<sup>th</sup> hardest place to follow Christ. This is largely due to radical Islamic attacks on churches, Christian schools and health centres.

#### Sri Lanka (30)

The horrific Easter church attacks, in which more than 250 people were killed, are the main reason that <u>Sri Lanka (30)</u> has jumped 16 places from number 46.

#### Bangladesh (38)

Bangladesh (38) has risen 10 places this year, and this reflects worsening persecution in all spheres of life, including a sharp increase in violence.

#### China (23)

In the past two years, <u>China (23)</u> has risen sharply on the World Watch List - from 43 in 2018. Increasingly, churches are pressured and monitored by the state.

#### Indonesia (49)

Indonesia (49) has fallen furthest of any country. This is largely because of its unusually high ranking in 2018, when coordinated attacks on three churches that killed 18 people.




